Kickstart for demolition in £16m college project

A HAMPSHIRE councillor got to help demolish his former school in the final stage of a college's £16 million transformation project.

Leader of Fareham Borough Council Cllr Seán Woodward was at Fareham College's Bishopsfield Road campus to mark the moment as buildings once part of Bishopsfield School came down.

The former pupil got behind the controls of an excavator to help get work underway, which will pave the way for more than 100 homes on that site.

The demolition of the building marks the last phase of Fareham College's



transformation project.

Launched in August 2014 this aimed to create new state-of-the-art learning facilities for students from Fareham, Gosport and the surrounding areas.

Alongside the Bishopsfield Road site, this includes the college's Centre of Excellence in Engineering, Manufacturing and Advanced Skills Training (CEMAST) facility in Leeon-the-Solent.

New facilities at Bishopsfield Road site include dedicated workshops, studios and innovative classrooms to cater for 3,700 students.
